The Academic Vice President is both the chief academic officer of the University and its second executive officer. Christian Brothers University seeks an academic leader with a strong record of teaching effectiveness, scholarship, faculty and program development, and success with academic initiatives who will guide the institution to a new era of academic excellence and mission fulfillment.

Founded in 1871 by the De LaSalle Christian Brothers, the largest lay teaching order in the Roman Catholic Church, Christian Brothers University is affiliated with five other U.S. colleges and universities and an international network of 29 Lasallian institutions of higher education. The University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, classified by the Carnegie system as a Master's/M, and ranked in the top 20 Southern universities by the 2010 *U.S. News and World Report's* "America's Best Colleges".

Currently reporting to the Academic Vice President are the heads of the four academic schools, graduate and professional studies, admissions, financial aid, information technology services, honors, and international initiatives. Working closely with the new President (July 2009), other vice presidents, reporting deans and directors, faculty, and other stakeholders, the Academic Vice President will set a vision for engaged student learning, faculty achievement, and strategic academic investment. The successful candidate will value the unique Lasallian mission of the University in both local and global contexts, will possess an earned Ph.D. or other terminal degree meriting tenure as a full professor in an academic department, and will have a successful record of appropriate administrative experience.
